FICTION

Zero K by Don DeLillo (F Del)

Ross Lockhart and his young wife, Artis, want to live in another world/utopia where they can choose their deaths, even though others close to them don't think this is a good idea.

Coconut Cowboy by Tim Dorsey (F Dor)

Inspired by the cult-classic movie, *Easy Rider*, dysfunctional duo Serge and Coleman travel across the wacky Sunshine State to rediscover the lost era of the American Dream, and find answers to particular questions.

At the Edge of the Orchard by Tracy Chevalier (F Che)

Picking up where *The Last Runaway* left off, this recounts first and second generation pioneering settlers in Ohio who journey west to California in the GoldRush.

The Lost Time Accidents by John Wray (F Wra)

Haunted by a failed love affair and a family secret, Waldemar Tolliver somehow unexpectedly awakens in the future 20th century, whereupon he has to find his way back.

Homecoming by Y'a'a Gyasi (F Gya)

A novel tracing three hundred years in Ghana and the Americas, and two sisters, Effia and Essi, and their families, shaped by historical forces seemingly beyond their control.

Exposure by Helen Dunmore (F Dun)

In London, in 1960, Holloway and Callington worry about a top-secret file that Simon's wife Lily has secretly hidden to protect her family. When Callington is arrested for spying for the Soviets, however, past truths and crimes of his, unknown to Lilly, come to light.

The Second Life of Nick Mason by Steve Hamilton (F Ham)

Released early from prison, Nick Mason's not truly able to rebuild his family life, being forced to commit increasingly dangerous crimes for criminal mastermind Darius Cole. How will he break free?

River Road by Carol Goodman (F Goo)

College professor Nan Lewis hits a deer while on her way home one night, but then becomes a suspect in the hit-and-run death of her student, Leia Dawson, and begins to suspect it is connected to the death of her daughter 6 years ago.

I'm Traveling Alone by Samuel Bjork (M Bjo)

Norwegian investigator Holger Munch, along with his colleague Mia Kruger, investigates the strange death of a woman found hanging lifeless from a tree.

When Falcons Fall by C.S. Harris (A Sebastian St. Cyr Mystery) (M Har)

Sebastian and Hero, visiting Shropshire to learn more of Sebastian's ancestry, investigate the death of an enigmatic young stranger in a peaceful village, only to uncover a series of mysterious killings.

Women Crime Writers: Four Suspense Novels of the 1950s (M Wom)

Forgotten novellas by Charlotte Armstrong, Patricia Highsmith, Margaret Millar, and Dolores Hitchens.

The Highway Man: A Longmire Story by Craig Johnson (M Joh)

Why is Wyoming Highway Patrol Officer Rosey Wayman receiving mysterious radio calls from Bobby Womack, a long-dead patrolman?

NON-FICTION, BIOGRAPHY & MEMOIR

Grit: The Power of Passion and Perseverance by Angela Duckworth (158.1 Duc)

Historical insights, experiments, and interviews with high achievers reveal that passion and perseverance, rather than "genius," lead to success.

All the Single Ladies: Unmarried Women and the Rise of an Independent Nation by Rebecca Traister (305.489 Tra)

Traces the increasing independence of American women in various large movements, as well as in education and housing. Describes how many contemporary women now being unmarried by the age of 29 will change the future.

The Witches: Salem, 1692 by Stacy Schiff (345.7445 Sch)

Late 17th century New England was a remote, barren, wilderness, with its people and young adolescent women particularly caught between Old and New World events, time, fairy and biblical world views, and tremendous anxiety, terror, and rebellion, in this chapter of New England and American history.

Dark Matter and the Dinosaurs by Lisa Randall (523.1126 Ran)

How are dark matter, the cosmos, the galaxy, and life's development and extinctions connected? Travel back 66 million years ago to find out!

The Brain: The Story of You by David Eagleman (612.82 Eag)

Did you know half of you is other people? The story of how your life shapes your brain, and how your brain shapes your life.

War at the End of the World: Douglas MacArthur and the Forgotten Fight for New Guinea, 1942-1945 by James P. Duffy (940.54265 Duf)

Chronicles a long over-looked part of World War II history in a tropical, unforgiving, and merciless terrain, where hundreds of thousands of Japanese, American, Australian, Dutch, and New Guinea troops fought and turned a strategic point of the Pacific war.

The Silk Roads: a New History of the World by Peter Frankopan (909 Fra)

A revelatory new history of the crossroads between empires, continents, and worlds.

Lust and Wonder by Augusten Burroughs (B Bur)

The author of Running with Scissors and Dry goes on to write of transitioning from his sordid past into adulthood, living in San Francisco and working in advertising, and starting a writing career.

John le Carré: The Biography by Adam Sisman (B Car)

On the complex, confounding, and at times enigmatic David Cornwell, the former British intelligence officer and prolific writer-creator of George Smiley, perhaps the most famous and well-liked fictional Cold War spy on both sides of the Iron Curtain.

The Rainbow Comes and Goes: A Mother and Son on Life, Love, and Loss by Anderson Cooper and Gloria Vanderbilt (B Co)

A year-long movingly humorous conversation between a mother and son about life, tragedies, and triumphs.

Turning the Tables: from Housewife to Inmate and Back Again by Teresa Giudice with K.C. Baker

The Real Housewives of New Jersey star writes on her childhood, husband, family, and her time in prison for federal fraud charges, far away from the glamorous world of reality TV.

Five Presidents by Clint Hill (B Hil)

A retired Secret Service agent's moving, insider story of his work for Presidents Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon, and Ford during a long, turbulent social and political era of American history.

The Genius of Michael Jackson by Steve Knopper (B Jac)

An appreciative, comprehensive look on the incomparable, talented, and strange life of the Motown pop star legend, from childhood to his final volatile years, comeback, untimely death, and music legacy, based on hundreds of unpaid interviews by the Rolling Stones magazine critic.

The Immortal Irishman: The Irish Revolutionary Who Became an American Hero by Timothy Egan (B Mea)

Thomas Francis Meagher, a life-long champion and dreamer of Irish freedom led a failed uprising in Ireland in the 1840s, fought in the American Civil War's fiercest battles, married heiress Libby Townsend, and eventually become an early territorial governor of Montana.
